Aims of the training	Enhancing the skills of professional career guidance providers by revising and practical use of the chosen techniques/activities included in the international collection of group career guidance (job counselling) techniques.
Subject matter	 Training methods related to professional orientation, change of the attitudes, activation and motivation, Methods dealing with resistance, conflicts, frustration, and resignation, methods for strengthening self-responsibility Methods related to vocational information, information management, labour market orientation. Work methods	The training course will be run with use of active workshop methods, so that the participants can understand, experience and practice the skills needed for working with groups using some chosen techniques of group career guidance (job counselling) included in the international NAVIGUIDE Project collection.
