

<b>Workshop 6 Warszawa, 11 November 2012</b>	
<b>Title of the Workshop:</b>	Testing of techniques related to vocational guidance in group setting elaborated in the international project NAVIGUDE
<b>Targetgroup:</b>	Representatives of Public Employment Services, educational and training organisations, trainers, job counsellors, workclub leaders, students of career counselling faculties and programs and other people interested in the subject of methodology of working with groups in the field of career counselling.
<b>Venue:</b>	Wyższa Szkoła Pedagogiczna TWP w Warszawie, ul. Urbanistów 3, Warszawa
<b>Date and time:</b>	11 November 2012 from 13.00pm to 18.00pm
<b>Specification:</b>	The training is one of activities performed by the international NAVIGUDE Project partnership, the objective of which was to develop an international collection of methods and techniques supporting the work of a career counsellor. The collection is based on materials owned by the Austrian Public Employment Service - AMS ( <a href="http://www.ams-forschungsnetzwerk.at">www.ams-forschungsnetzwerk.at</a> ), developed in the years 2008 – 2010, and contains over 400 methods that can be used for group career guidance (job counselling).
<b>Aims of the training</b>	Enhancing the skills of professional career guidance providers by revising and practical use of the chosen techniques/activities included in the international collection of group career guidance (job counselling) techniques.
<b>Subject matter</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Training methods related to professional orientation, change of the attitudes, activation and motivation,</li> <li>2. Methods dealing with resistance, conflicts, frustration, and resignation, methods for strengthening self-responsibility</li> <li>3. Methods related to vocational information, information management, labour market orientation.</li> <li>4. Methods related to analysis of potential</li> <li>5. Methods related to educational and career choices</li> <li>6. Methods related to application training and finding a job</li> <li>7. Training methods developing social skills.</li> </ol>
<b>Work methods</b>	<p>The training course will be run with use of active workshop methods, so that the participants can understand, experience and practice the skills needed for working with groups using some chosen techniques of group career guidance (job counselling) included in the international NAVIGUDE Project collection.</p> <p>The workshop method assumes maximum and active participation of the trainees, at the same time minimizing the traditional ways of sharing the knowledge.</p> <p>It owes its exceptional effectiveness to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Learning through experience</li> <li>• Creating personal involvement.</li> </ul> <p>The workshops are based on the group dynamics and exploring the potential of the participants.</p>

	<p>The following techniques will be used during the training:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Activities (e.g. games, mini-simulations) introducing the subject</li> <li>• Larger exercise structures – longer simulations integrating several skills</li> <li>• Short lectures introducing and summing up the issue and the technique being tested</li> <li>• Plenary group discussions analysing activities and their possible consequences.</li> </ul>
